

WHAT IS A STEM AMBASSADOR?



STEM Ambassadors are volunteers from a wide range of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) related jobs and disciplines, they support young people and their learning by participating in school and community STEM events. By participating in the STEM Ambassador programme you could raise students aspirations, helping young people understand the real world applications of what they learn in school and where they could go with a career in STEM, as well as having your volunteer time recognised through our digital badging scheme. If you have a passion to inspire the next generation in STEM then please join our Ambassador community!



For employer groups, becoming a STEM Ambassador is simple, just ask your team to [sign up here](#)! Your team will be asked to complete a short training that covers an introduction to volunteering and child safeguarding. The final step is completing a DBS Check, which is free for all volunteers.

SUPPORT FOR EMPLOYERS

If you're keen to develop an outreach programme then the STEM Ambassador programme could support you:



- Be a part of a nationally recognised programme working with schools, young people, universities, employers and institutions across the UK.
- Opt in to sector specific schemes that may complement your industry focus or long term goals such as GoConstruct (construction) or Climate Ambassadors (sustainability).
- For employers with a minimum of 10 approved STEM Ambassadors a named contact can be given access to the employer dashboard, allowing you to manage your Ambassador cohort and their activities. A data sharing agreement is required with STEM Learning.

Promoting the STEM Ambassador Programme to your team - Virtual Lunch & Learn Sessions

This training is designed to support employer groups who have a particular project in mind. A live, online session that will be tailored to your project, with a focus on communication and child safeguarding.

BECOMING A STEM AMBASSADOR - THE APPROVAL PROCESS



The STEM Induction & DBS Check process is managed by the central support team, this process is the same for all Ambassadors across the UK. After registering you will receive an invitation to complete the STEM Induction training, this is a module based training covering an introduction to the programme and child safeguarding.

Once you've completed the STEM Induction training the central support team will then send you a link to your DBS Application. The DBS Application will ask you for your name, date of birth, your 5 years address history and then to complete an ID Check. The ID Check is completed digitally, if applicants hold an e-passport then this is the only bit of ID that they will need. If, for any reason, the ID Check can not be completed digitally then an in-person ID Check may be required.

WHAT DOES A DBS CHECK INVOLVE?

Step 1: Complete the DBS Application

Step 2: Complete an ID Check

All STEM Ambassadors must hold a valid Enhanced Child Workforce DBS Check, DBS Checks are issued free of charge by the STEM Ambassador programme.

GETTING INVOLVED AS A STEM AMBASSADOR

FINDING A STEM EVENT

As an employer group you may prefer to co-ordinate your own STEM events, creating opportunities for your Ambassadors to get involved and work together to deliver inspiring & engaging events with young people. The STEM Ambassador programme also receives regular requests from schools for support which employer groups can volunteer for. This could be giving a talk, hosting a stand at a careers fair, judging a competition, running a workshop or curriculum support.

All events need to be recorded on the individual STEM Ambassadors activity log, Ambassadors are able to record their events themselves by logging in to their STEM profile. Ambassadors must participate in at least one event a year or their STEM profile will become inactive and then be suspended. If Ambassadors need help recording their events, or you have participated in any large events as a group, then please contact us for assistance recording your events.
